The Forestry meeting will be conducted in an informal open format so that Village residents can come have their questions answered and leave any time between the meeting hours of 7:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m.

Lincolnshire residents have always demonstrated an appreciation for the Village's beautiful trees. Don't miss this opportunity to have your tree questions answered and to learn about ongoing programs that the Forester administers to keep the Village's trees healthy.

Did You Know?

Dog Run Fences

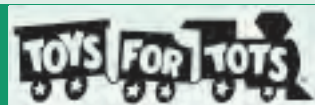
The Village has specific regulations that need to be followed prior to the installation of a dog run fence. The Village defines a dog run fence as an enclosed area for the temporary containment of a dog or dogs. According to section 6-15-5 of the Village Code, there are general requirements that must be met for a fence to be considered compliant, so that a Building Permit can be issued. These requirements are as follows:

1. **Height:** Dog run fences are permitted up to six feet (6') in height and up to 250 square feet in area.
2. **Materials:** Dog run fences may be constructed of metallic material. Chain link fencing may be used provided it is made up of a minimum of eleven gauge wire with a mesh size not to exceed one and a half inches (1-1/2").
3. **Location:** Dogs runs are not allowed to be installed in any required yard setback area and may not extend beyond any facade of the primary structure facing or be visible to the public way.

Prior to the installation of any fence, you must first submit a completed Building Permit Application, as well as copies of the plans and a plat of survey of the proposed fence to the Building Division in the Community Development Department. Plans will then be reviewed and a Building Permit issued once all details are Code compliant. Annual Toys for Tots Collection



Once again the Village of Lincolnshire will have a collection box for "Toys for Tots" beginning on Monday, November 17th.

Toys for Tots began in 1947 when Major Bill Hendricks, United States Marine Corps Reserve and a group of Marine Reservists in Los Angeles collected and distributed 5,000 toys to needy children. The idea came from Bill's wife, Diane. In the fall of 1947, Diane handcrafted a Raggedy Ann doll and asked Bill to deliver the doll to an organization, which would give it to a needy child at Christmas. When Bill determined that no agency existed, Diane told Bill that he should start one. He did. The 1947 pilot project was so successful that the Marine Corps adopted Toys for Tots in 1948 and expanded it into a nationwide campaign. That year, Marine Corps Reserve units across the nation conducted Toys for Tots campaigns in each community in which a Marine Reserve Center was located. Marines have conducted successful nationwide campaigns at Christmas each year since 1948. In 2001, Toys for Tots ranked #289th in "Philanthropy 400" and in 2005 it ranked 66 in "Philanthropy 400"!

Mayor Blomberg would like to make Toys for Tots an annual charity in the Village and we encourage all of the businesses and residents to hop on board! Fall Leaf Collection

The Public Works Department began its annual Leaf Collection Program on Monday, October 6th. Leaves must be placed in the street by noon on Wednesday of your specified pickup week to guarantee one final collection by Friday. Leaves placed in the street after that final collection is made will not be picked up until your next scheduled week of collection.

Leaf pickup is scheduled for Monday through Friday according to the following schedule:

Residents West of Riverwoods Rd.	Residents East of Riverwoods Rd.
Week of November 3	Week of November 10
Week of November 17	Week of November 24
Week of December 1	

Please be careful not to mix foreign materials such as brush, garden waste, tree limbs, vines, lumber, etc. with your leaves. Materials such as these can cause equipment failure or injury to the operator or nearby citizens.

Due to the large volume of leaves, Public Works' crews can only pick up leaves on one side of the Village each week. It is important to follow the schedule and not place leaves in the street for more than two to three days before your scheduled week of pickup. You may rake your leaves and place them on your grass near the curb as shown in the picture, then rake them into the street during your scheduled week. Leaves piled in the street during off-scheduled weeks become a fire hazard and can obstruct drivers' views of children at play. They also block the storm sewer inlets causing localized flooding. Please notify your landscaper of the Village's leaf pickup schedule if applicable.

Child Safety Seats

With the holidays approaching, residents should be aware that the Village loans infant and toddler booster seats, without charge, on a first-come, first-serve basis. If you have relatives or friends with children coming into town for the upcoming holidays and need an infant, toddler or booster seat, call 847-883-9900 to reserve your seat. Please call early. The supply is limited!



We have two infant seats that can be used for children up to 22 pounds (rear facing only) and three seats that can be used either forward or rear facing. If they are rear facing, they can be used by children up to 22 pounds and if forward facing, children up to 40 pounds can use them.

We also have three belt positioning booster seats that can be used for children between 30 and 100 pounds in conjunction with the three point seat belt system in the vehicle. All eight seats are equipped to be used with the LATCH systems in all new vehicles.

Open Gym

The Open Gym Program continues on Sundays, between September 28th and March 22nd, at Half Day School from 12:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. There will be two gyms available. Children under 12 years old must be accompanied by an adult who must remain on the premises. Basketball may be played. A one-time season release is required before anyone is allowed to participate, and the weekly fee is \$3.00. Releases will also be available at both the Village Hall and during Open Gym. Parents should not drop off children at Half Day School without being sure that releases have been signed.



There will be no Open Gym on November 23, November 30, December 21 and December 28, 2008 and January 4, 2009.

Want to Run for Office?

Petition packets are available at the Village Hall, as well as the Lake County Clerk's Office, for candidates planning to run for Trustee in the Consolidated Election on April 7, 2009. The first day the petitions can be circulated is Tuesday, October 28th.

Three Trustees' seats with four year terms will be decided in this election. Nomination papers for new political parties, independents and nonpartisan candidates must be filed at the Village Hall between January 19, 2009 and January 26, 2009.

Residents should know that petitions should be signed by registered voters only, and you do not necessarily have to be "for" the candidate to sign his/her petition. By signing it you are recognizing the candidate's right to run for office.

Monday, November 10th - The Budget will appear as an item for discussion on the Committee of the Whole Meeting agenda. This will be your opportunity to comment on the document and on discussions by Board members at the previous Budget meetings.

Final Budget consideration and approval is expected to occur on December 8th.

interize Your Home!



One of the easiest things you can do as cold weather approaches, is to walk around your home and check for air gaps. Air gaps let heat out and cold air in. Heating costs are going to be even higher this year so every little bit helps!

Areas where you may find air gaps in your home:

- dropped ceilings
- attic entrance
- plumbing utilities and penetration
- all ducts
- chimney
- window sashes and frames
- electrical outlets and switches
- baseboards, coves and interior trim
- recessed lights
- electric wires and box
- water and furnace flues
- door sashes and frames
- warm air register
- sill plates
- light fixtures
- plumbing access panel

Feel, with your hand around door frames, windows, electrical outlets, fans, cracks or any other location you think cold air can get in. If you are not sure, you can light a match or incense stick. Hold the stick next to the gap and see if the flame travels horizontally. If it does you have a gap or leak.

- Caulk cracks or gaps around the outside of your home. (This will also help to keep rodents from getting into your nice warm home!)
- Caulk inside your home. Use paintable caulk so that you can conceal it.
- Install rubber gaskets behind outlet and switch plates on exterior walls.
- If possible, replace single pane windows or add storm windows. If this is not possible, you can use heavy clear plastic over the window secured tightly to the frame.
- Keep fireplace flues closed when not in use.
- Look for dark spots on your insulation. These spots are usually a sign of a leak. Seal the leak. While you are there see if you have adequate insulation. The cost to install adequate insulation will soon be recouped by savings on your heating and cooling bills!
- Apply weather stripping to your doors and windows – including your garage doors.

A few simple efforts will yield a nice warm winter for you and your family and will help keep your heating costs down!

Prescribed Burns

Prescribed burns are an essential part of natural area management. Fire suppresses the growth of non native plants and encourages the development of native plants. A healthy, native environment provides important habitat for native plants and animals.



Fall burns will be underway throughout the Village. Only portions of sites can be burned at any given time. The Village will be burning some portions of the following locations during the first few weeks of November:

North Park

Florsheim Park

Rivershire Park

Please note that in most locations burning will take only one to two days. Dates and times of burns are dependent upon weather and site conditions, i.e. strong winds create too much smoke and make the fires unstable, rain makes the burns too smoky and not hot enough to eradicate non-native plants.

If you are out in the natural areas of the Village this fall and you see an area that has been burned, be sure to come back in the spring and look at how beautiful these areas are when the strong native plants come up and the ground is a verdant green!

ecreation and Commercial Vehicle Regulations for Residential Areas

In the October Lincolnshire Newsletter, there was a misprint regarding the definition of Commercial Vehicles. The article inferred that all vehicles bearing a "Class B" registration plate are prohibited from parking overnight in the residential areas of the Village. This is incorrect. Vehicles with "Class B" registration plates **ARE PERMITTED** as long as they don't contain any commercial advertising, signs, logos, lettering or have any attached equipment used for commercial enterprise, including but not limited to ladder racks, cargo containers or special operating lights.

Building Your Emergency Kit



It is recommended that each family in the Village have an emergency plan and emergency kits.

Start by holding a family meeting to determine what you need to do to develop a plan of action. Each family member should be included in the planning process. One easy thing to start on – and an activity easily accomplished with family participation – is to build your emergency kit. The following steps will get you going.

1. Make a goal to add one or two things to your kit each month or as many as you can. Set a date when these kits will be complete and make sure each family member knows the completion date. Adults and children can keep their eyes open for items that need to be included in the kit as you go about your home or shopping.
2. Start with a back pack for each family member. In the event of an emergency, each family member can help to carry the load, and should you get separated, each person has the necessary materials they need. Designate a storage location close to the main exit of your home so the kits are readily available. Make sure every family member knows this location. **IMPORTANT:** Make a family pact that items will not be removed from the emergency kits unless it is an emergency and that used items are immediately replaced.
3. Following is a list of items for your kits that would be helpful to you and your family in an emergency:
 - Flashlight – some stores carry flashlight/radio combinations that are wind up. You don't need batteries and they are relatively inexpensive. Check REI, Uncle Dans, Erehwon or on the Internet. They range from \$15 to \$30!
 - Radio with extra batteries (unless you get the wind up kind.)
 - 3 Day Supply of Medication
 - Plastic storage
 - Plastic sheeting
 - Paper towels, towelettes
 - Liquid or bar soap
 - Hat and gloves
 - Garbage bags
 - Map of the area
 - Baby supplies (diapers, formula, wipes)
 - Whistle
 - Compass
 - Paper plates and cups
 - Change of underwear
 - Glasses and/or contact lenses
 - Roll of twine
 - List of your physicians and any health conditions
 - Lightweight high energy food (non perishable, i.e. protein bars, granola bars, etc.)
 - First Aid kit
 - Duct tape
 - Matches (waterproof)
 - Toilet paper
 - Pliers and wrench
 - Notebook and pen
 - Cash or travelers checks
 - Toothbrush and toothpaste
 - Feminine supplies
 - Needle and thread
 - Aluminum foil
 - Extra pair of shoes and socks
 - Utility knife
 - Bottle of water
 - Camera
 - Pet supplies
 - Bottled water

Believe it or not - all of this does fit nicely in a medium size backpack! For children or those with physical problems, you may wish to get a small roll cart to facilitate everyone's ability to have their own kit and take it with them.
