## Recreational and Commercial Vehicle Regulations for Residential Areas

As some residents are aware, the Village Board recently revisited our recreational and commercial vehicle regulations, which resulted in the adoption of a number of Code revisions (see below). This process was undertaken in response to resident concerns and in an effort to improve the way the Village Code addresses these two types of vehicles in order to both clarify the Code requirements and reduce the potentially negative impact of these vehicles on adjacent residential homes.

The most common examples of recreational vehicles include boats, camping trailers, and snowmobiles. A summary of the revised recreational vehicle regulations is presented below:



- Only one (1) recreational vehicle may be parked outdoors on a residential lot.
- The vehicle may only be parked in an interior side yard. Corner side yards and rear yards are not allowed for parking of recreational vehicles.
- The vehicle may not be parked closer than 10' from any interior side lot line.
- No part of the vehicle may project beyond the predominant front plane or rear plane of a house or garage to which it is immediately attached.
- The vehicle may only be parked on an approved paved surface, compacted, or impervious surface.
- The vehicle must be fully screened from adjacent properties, excluding the right-of-way, via vegetation, as viewed at a height of 6' from the prevailing grade level of the adjoining properties. The vegetation must be sufficiently dense and tall at any time the vehicle is parked on the lot.

In view of the newly adopted regulations, it is important to recognize that some residential lots in the Village are conducive to unobtrusive outdoor parking of recreational vehicles, while others are not. In cases where the lot layout or other conditions do not afford an opportunity for appropriate outdoor recreational vehicle storage, the vehicle should be moved into the garage, if space allows, or to an off-site storage facility.

With regard to commercial vehicles, the Village Code now prohibits the parking of commercial vehicles on residential lots, due to their commercial nature, which is incompatible with residential uses. (Commercial vehicles are vehicles that are required to bear Class D license plates or greater, livery plates, Class B license plates, or vehicles that contain commercial advertising or carry commercial equipment.) The Village Code does make an exception for loaner or courtesy cars that are permitted to be parked on residential lots, as long as they remain there for a limited time. In addition, please be aware that temporary (up to 7 days) parking of commercial vehicles solely for loading, unloading, and maintenance is allowed with prior approval from the Village's Chief of Police or his designated agent. # Fall Leaf Collection

The Public Works Department will begin its annual Leaf Collection Program on Monday, October 6th. Leaves must be placed in the street by noon on Wednesday of your specified pickup week to guarantee one final collection by Friday. Leaves placed in the street after that final collection is made will not be picked up until your next scheduled week of collection.

Leaf pickup is scheduled for Monday through Friday according to the following schedule:

<b>Residents West of Riverwoods Rd.</b>	<b>Residents East of Riverwoods Rd</b>
Week of October 6	Week of October 13
Week of October 20	Week of October 27
Week of November 3	Week of November 10
Week of November 17	Week of November 24
Week of December 1	

Please be careful not to mix foreign materials such as brush, garden waste, tree limbs, vines, lumber, etc. with your leaves. Materials such as these can cause equipment failure or injury to the operator or nearby citizens.

Due to the large volume of leaves, Public Works' crews can only pick up leaves on one side of the Village each week. It is important to follow the schedule and not place leaves in the street for more than two to three days before your scheduled week of pickup. You may rake your leaves and place them on your grass near the curb as shown in the picture, then rake them into the street during your scheduled week. Leaves piled in the street during off-scheduled weeks become a fire hazard and can obstruct drivers' views of children at play. They also block the storm sewer inlets causing localized flooding. Please notify your landscaper of the Village's leaf pickup schedule if applicable.

# Halloween Safety Tips

Parents and children should observe the following safety tips on Halloween:

- Before eating treats, have your children bring them home for a parent's inspection.
- Costumes should be light in color, and children should carry flash lights pointed at the ground after dark. Strips of reflective tape on clothes are a good idea. Use makeup instead of masks that can obstruct vision.
- Children should be instructed to be careful when walking in the street or on the lawn near curbs.
- Be sure that your young children are accompanied by an adult or responsible teenager while they are trick or treating.
- Know which friends your children will be with and the route they will be taking.
- Children should not enter any home unless it is one of a relative or known friend.
- Children should be respectful and courteous to the property of others.
- Leave your porch light on so children will know they are welcome to visit your home. This will also discourage vandalism.
- Don't invite trick or treaters into your home unless you know them.
- Keep pets inside the house or garage on Halloween night.
- Children should not play in or near the piles of leaves near the street.

# Car Break-ins



Recently there has been an increase in the reported number of car break-ins occurring not only in Lake County, but all across the country. The main targets are GPS units and lap-top computers. It takes a thief about 10 seconds to break a window and grab an object which is 99.9% of the time in plain view. Even if the car alarm is set off, most people have become immune to the alarms. Because they are frequently going off for no reason, people don't pay attention to the alarm source. All the thief has to do is casually walk away from the car he has just hit, and he won't draw attention to himself. Keep in mind that not only are you going to lose your property, but now you have to go through the inconvenience of having your vehicle serviced to have a costly window replaced.

Here are a few basic reminders that will help you to avoid being a victim:

- Place all items out of sight either in the console, under the seat, or better yet, the trunk
- Don't keep tollway change visible in the cup holder or a coin holder
- If you have a GPS unit and it is usually affixed to your windshield, remember to remove the suction cup mount also, not just the GPS unit. **Thieves have become so bold that if they see the suction cup "marks" on your windshield, they will break into your vehicle anticipating the GPS is hidden somewhere in the passenger compartment.** Wipe the marks from the windshield.
- If you are traveling and stop for fuel, food or a quick break, hide your valuables.
- Always, always, always, lock your vehicle even in your own driveway. Thieves will rummage around an unlocked car looking for anything of value from CD's to watches to credit cards. **Lock your vehicle!!!** It's the #1 deterrent to theft.
- Park near or under street lights or parking lot lights whenever possible. Thieves do not like lit-up areas. Park as close to a hotel/motel front entrance as practical. Foot traffic is also a deterrent.

While this list is certainly not complete, these few common sense measures will work in your favor to help keep you from becoming a victim of a vehicle break-in.

# Traps & Bats



Recently there has been an increase in the reported number of bats being infected with rabies in Lake County. While the Police Department does have traps available for some wild or sick and injured animals, it does not have equipment necessary to safely remove a bat from your residence. The good news is that the Lake County Health Department Animal Control Division does! If you have a bat trapped inside your residence, or have a bat somewhere exterior to your home that **appears sick or injured, is laying on the ground, or flying during daylight**, contact the Lake County Health Department at 847-949-9925, and they will respond to assist you without any cost. They advise that if you have a bat inside your residence, try to confine it to a specific place by closing off doors or windows, and stay away from it until they arrive. If the bat is outside and **appears sick or injured, is laying on the ground, or flying during daylight**, again stay away from it and call Lake County. In addition to the Lake County Health Department, there are also a wide variety of private animal extermination and removal companies available in the area. They can be located in the phone book or on the internet. The Police Department also maintains a list should you have difficulty locating one.

**If you are bitten by a bat, try to somehow safely catch, trap or confine the bat without putting you or anyone else in harm's way until the health department can arrive. You should seek medical attention immediately. This may save you from having to go through the painful and expensive rabies-shot treatment. While there have been rabid bats identified in Lake County, there have not been any other animals infected with rabies found in more than 20 years according to Lake County.**

Parents should educate their children in what a bat looks like and to never touch or get near a bat if they come across one.

While bats appear creepy or scary, healthy bats do serve a very important ecological service by helping to control the insect population. They can eat up to 600 insects per hour and help control pests that destroy crops and vegetation.

The Police Department does not have traps for bats, but we do have a limited number of other traps available on a first-come, first-served basis. You can call the Police Department at 847-883-9900 for further information on our animal control services.

# Budget Process for Fiscal Year 2009

We have begun working on the new Budget that will guide the Village from January 1, 2009 through December 31, 2009. The following dates have been tentatively scheduled for resident input into this process:

## *Month of November*

The Mayor and Board of Trustees will establish special meetings during this month and will discuss a draft Budget. This draft, which will be available at the Village Hall and the Vernon Area Public Library for your review as of October 17th, will include personnel, programs, and capital expenditures.

## *Monday, November 10th*

The Budget will appear as an item for discussion on the Committee of the Whole Meeting agenda. This will be your opportunity to comment on the document and on discussions by Board members at the previous week's Budget meetings.

Final Budget consideration and approval is expected to occur on December 8th. # Voting Information for the 2008 General Election



## ***Candidate Signage***

As the Consolidated Election draws near, we want to remind residents of Village regulations regarding political signs. The Village Code has been amended to regulate the size of political signs.

The maximum size for political signs is six square feet, which is the size of a standard 2 foot by 3 foot sign, and they cannot be any higher than four feet off the ground.

All political signs must be displayed no more than fourteen days prior the election, and removed within two days after an election. **No political signs should go up before October 21st, and they should be taken down by November 6th.** On Wednesday, November 5th, when you take out your garbage, it is suggested you take out your lawn sign as well.

Signs must be placed on private property with the consent of the homeowner. Private property typically begins fifteen feet from the roadway. Rights-of-way along roads such as Riverwoods Road, Route 22, and Milwaukee Avenue are not private property. Any signage along these roadways must be placed on private property with the consent of the property owners. Any signage not meeting this criteria will be removed by Village personnel.

## ***Register to Vote!***

The last day to Register to Vote is Tuesday, October 7th! Register at the Village Hall, One Olde Half Day Rd. Office Hours are Mon. - Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Exercise your right to vote! In some countries they can't!

## ***Early Voting has Arrived***

Early voting will be offered to any eligible voter, without reason (i.e. not required to be absent, physically disabled, etc.) beginning Monday, October 13th through Thursday October 30th.

Voters are required to present a valid Illinois driver's license, a non-driver identification card issued by the Illinois Secretary of State or another government issued identification document containing the voter's photograph and address.

Absentee Voting by mail or in-person begins at the Lake County Administrative Offices, 10 N. County Street, Waukegan, IL 60085, Telephone: 847-377-2406, on Thursday, September 25th until the start of early voting on Friday, October 3rd. The County will continue to mail absentee ballots to voters who request them via email or by phone until Thursday, October 30th. # Emergency Planning

Is your family ready for an Emergency? What if your house was flooded? What if there was a fire? A tornado? What would you take with you if you needed to evacuate your home within minutes without ever having the ability to go home again? What would you do? Having a family plan and practicing that plan are keys to getting through a major crisis. Here are some steps you and your family should take to prepare for a disaster.



1. **Inventory Your Life** - Make a list of all of your possessions and important personal documents. This list should include photographs of the items, receipts, and other helpful information to document what you own. This list will be helpful if you need to file an insurance claim. Remember to store this list in a secure location away from your home, such as at a safe-deposit box or with someone you can trust.
2. **Records** - Gather important personal papers such as bank accounts, tax returns, prescriptions, family records, and other important documents. Store them in a fire-proof box that can be readily moved in the case of an evacuation.
3. **Family Plan** - If you had to evacuate, where would you go? Remember, you may not always be able to meet at the same location due to changing conditions, so make sure that you have alternative meeting locations. Also, consider that your family may not all be together when an evacuation occurs. Therefore, your plan should include a meeting place known to all family members.
4. **Supplies** - Prepare a small box that you can grab as you evacuate your home. You should include your life inventory, important personal documents, baby supplies, pet supplies, medications, and other items to help you survive away from your home. What do you need to get by if you have to evacuate your home? Medications, pet supplies, baby supplies, if applicable, supplies, computer hard-drive, batteries, food, water, and other items should be stored together in boxes so that they can be gathered quickly.
5. **Test It** - Finally, planning is not good unless it is tested. Take 10 minutes to "evacuate" your home. Afterwards, decide if you took the right things. Refine your plan and practice it again.

This is done to prevent ice buildup in the streets which could create a hazard to both motorists and pedestrians alike, as well as cause excessive damage to our roadways and snow removal equipment.

Clean your grates! In the fall and spring, and after heavy rains, be sure to check the storm sewer grates on the street by your house and in your yard. Grates clogged with leaves and trash can cause flooding. Please remove the debris away from the grate. 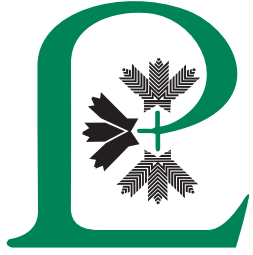
