Village-wide Emergency Telephone Notification System

Getting the word out to the residents and businesses within the Village of Lincolnshire of a critical situation or an emergency in a timely and efficient manner is of utmost importance. There have been times in the past where due to a watermain break the Village has issued a "boil order" for drinking water until the pipes were fixed; a missing person was reported; for emergency road closures; or Des Plaines River flooding reports. The Village had relied on a telephone notification system which took hours and hours to call the residents, or Village employees had to go door-to-door making these notifications.



Given today's technology, quicker systems are now available. A few years ago the Village entered into a contract agreement with the NTI Group to utilize their CONNECT-CTY Community Notification System. This system is capable of placing thousands of telephone calls within a matter of minutes. The confidential database of telephone numbers is provided and maintained by the NTI Group and updated monthly. There are no equipment purchases required by the Village and the beauty of this system is the cost to the Village is a little over \$2 per year per household.

Like any system, it is only as good as the information in the database. WE NEED YOUR HELP!!!

If you have an unlisted or unpublished telephone number, there is a very good chance you are not in the database. We need and want you IN! While you may opt not to be in the system, why would you? **Please be assured your information will not be released to anyone, and the Village will not "cry wolf" and overuse the system. It will be used for emergencies and exigent circumstances only.**

Here's how the CONNECT-CTY notification system works. In the event of a notification, the system will dial the PRIMARY telephone number for the residence and relay a recorded message advising of the emergency or exigent circumstance. If the telephone line is busy or there is no answer, the system will automatically make three (3) re-try attempts. If the line is still busy or there is still no answer after the third re-try, the system will disregard any further calls. If the telephone is answered by an answering machine, a recorded message will be left. The system is also capable of calling a SECONDARY telephone phone such as a cell phone or sending a message to an E-MAIL address. Each residence can have any or all three of these contact numbers called **and we encourage you to do this.**

When the message is sent to an E-mail address, it is sent as a .WAV audio file which can be played through your Windows Media Player. The Windows Media Player is included with the Windows operating system, or it can be downloaded from the Microsoft Website. While the secondary phone and E-mail are optional, we really need your primary house telephone number at a minimum. **Please be assured that this information will be used by the Village of Lincolnshire for official business only and will be confidentially maintained and not disseminated.**

Also, all of the businesses within the Village are already included in this database.

To assist those of you whose numbers are unlisted or who would like to add a secondary number or E-mail address, we have set up a link on the Village's website. If you go to www.village.lincolnshire.il.us, find the link "SIGN UP NOW/CONNECT-CTY", Village Notification System tab on the left side of the homepage. A form will drop down in which you may enter your information. We will then update the database with your personal information. If you do not have Internet access, we can enter the information for you. Contact Chief of Police Randy Melvin at 847-913-2341 and we will be glad to assist you.

We hope that everyone takes advantage of this community safety program. It is an excellent way to be directly in touch with the Village. *This system will not take the place of the emergency warning siren system. As a reminder, if you hear a steady 3-minute siren, a tornado is in the area and you should take shelter immediately.*

If you receive a notification message, please do not call the police department as our lines will be swamped and we won't be able to receive normal calls. You can always go to the Village's website for further information or follow the instructions in the message on how to replay the message.

Recent Board Action

At its Regular Village Board Meeting of June 22nd the Village Board of Trustees approved:

- An Ordinance Revising the Entire Sign Code - Title 12.
- A four-month moratorium on the issuance of permits for, and the erection of, any wind energy or solar energy device.
- An Ordinance Adopting the Prevailing Wage Rates to be paid Public Laborers, Mechanics and Other Workers performing Construction of Works for the Village of Lincolnshire.
- The use of Spring Lake Park and Village Streets for the 4th of July celebration.
- An Ordinance amending Title 5-2-3B4 regarding Crushed Stone Driveways
- An Ordinance Amending a Joint Agreement with the Illinois Department of Transportation for the Improvement of Illinois Route 22 at Milwaukee Avenue.

At its Regular Village Board Meeting of July 13th the Village Board of Trustees approved:

- An Ordinance Amending Definitions, to define Multi-User Buildings within Zoning Definitions; Permitted Uses in the O/Ic and O/Id Office/Industrial Zoning Subdistrict, to permit multi-user office/warehouse buildings, with certain restrictions.
- A bid from Trine Construction Corporation, for the Hydrant Replacement Program.

Did You Know?

Did you know that the Village of Lincolnshire has specific regulations pertaining to public nuisances. The Village defines a nuisance as any of the following acts, omissions or conditions:

1. A act which shall offend public decency.
2. An act that unlawfully interferes with or obstructs or renders dangerous for passage, a public walk, park or place.
3. The obstruction of any gutter, culvert, inlet, or other drainage way causing stagnant or foul water.
4. Allowing garbage or offensive substances of any kind to be collected, deposited or to remain in any public way within the Village.
5. Buildings, walls or other structures that have been damaged by fire or decay, due to their condition and may endanger the safety of the public.

You may not be aware of this but the Village prohibits any resident from maintaining the existence of any nuisance on any property under his or her control or to conduct any act which the Village has either declared, prohibited or considered to be a nuisance. From a property maintenance standpoint, the following are the most common nuisances within the Village and should be avoided and resolved as soon as possible:

1. Dumping and depositing any grass, leaves, branches, parts of trees or any other things in any public way within the Village.
2. Dumping, depositing or storing material of any kind on any real property in the Village, unless it is incidental to residential use (ex. grill, patio furniture, etc.)
3. Permitting the growth of lawn grasses on vacant land or improved property within the Village in excess of six inches (6") in height.

By eliminating these concerns we can maintain the high standards the residents, Mayor, Board of Trustees and staff expect and in which we all take pride.

Water Meter Readings

The Village of Lincolnshire's Water Department will be reading inside water meters for single-family homes located south of Route 22 and east of Riverwoods Road. Inspections will be performed from 8:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, through the month of August. Inside meter readings are taken every third year to verify that the inside meter matches the outside meter readings. To eliminate the need to enter each house quarterly, the outside meter is read to determine the owner's water usage. This program assures you the accuracy of the meter readings.

This program also includes a mandated inspection of your plumbing system and sump pumps. The average time required per property is about ten minutes.



Budget Process for Fiscal Year 2010

We have begun working on the new Budget that will guide the Village from January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2010. The following dates have been tentatively scheduled for resident input into this process:



Monday, September 14th

Residents and representatives of Village organizations are encouraged to attend this Committee of the Whole Meeting if there are particular projects or priorities they would like the Board to consider for Fiscal Year 2010. If you cannot attend, you may send a written request to the Village.

Month of November

The Mayor and Board of Trustees will establish special meetings during this month and will discuss a draft Budget. This draft, which will be available at the Village Hall and the Vernon Area Public Library for your review as of October 16th, will include personnel, programs, and capital expenditures.

Monday, November 9th

The Budget will appear as an item for discussion on the Committee of the Whole Meeting Agenda. This will be your opportunity to comment on the document and on discussions by Board members at the previous week's Budget meetings.

Final Budget consideration and approval is expected to occur on December 14th.

Your Pets

Licenses - Dogs and cats no longer have to be registered in the Village. **Dogs are still required to be vaccinated for rabies annually and wear the rabies tag issued by the Lake County Health Department.**

Dog and cat owners should make sure their pets are wearing some type of identification tag in the event they are picked up by the Police Department. This will ensure your animal's speedy and safe return.



Number of Pets - The Lincolnshire Village Code specifies that residents may have up to three (3) dogs or three (3) cats, or a combination of three dogs or cats at a residence in the Village. Any more than three (3) dogs or cats is a violation and could result in a ticket being issued.

Animal Litter - The Police Department is receiving more complaints of animal owners allowing their pets to defecate on property other than their own and not picking up the waste. The problem is evident along the Village's bike paths. **This is a violation of the Village Code and could result in a \$50.00 ticket.** Be respectful and responsible and pick up after your pet wherever you are, and please help keep our Village attractive.

Parks - As a reminder, dogs are not allowed in any of the Village's parks at any time.

Pets on a Leash - While off your property, the Village Code requires your pet to be under your direct control at all times. While some pets are very well trained, most require being on a leash. Also, even when on your property, your dog may become startled or excited when a walker or jogger goes by and they could dart at or charge the person. Please keep your pet under your control at all times when outdoors.

The Village has received numerous complaints regarding lights flickering, power outages and surges. These outages may be the result of weather conditions, accidents, or equipment failure. The Village is in contact with ComEd officials and is working with them to identify the source of the service interruptions.

The Village has set up a special email site to gather information on service interruptions. If your lights flicker or you have an outage, call Commonwealth Edison at 1-800-EDISON1 (1-800-334-7661). Also please send an email to electricity-outage@village.lincolnshire.il.us. You should include the following information in your email:

Name, Address, Type of Incident: outage, surge or flickering;

Date of Incident, Duration of Incident;

Contact information (email or phone number) where we may reach you if we have questions about the incident.

We will use the information gathered to identify problem areas and will work with ComEd to improve service. **Tell your neighbors!**

No More Batteries at Household Chemical Waste



The Department of Transportation (DOT) recently implemented a new packaging requirement for alkaline batteries that will make it very expensive for The Solid Waste Agency of Lake County to take batteries at their Household Chemical Waste Collection Events. As a result, they will not be taking these batteries anymore.

Batteries, during shipment, that are not individually secured, have the ability of coming into contact with each other and can create excessive heat or even fire. Terminals need to be taped to keep them from contacting each other. Because of the thousands of batteries received at Household Chemical Waste Collection events, it is not feasible or cost effective to tape each of the batteries received.

Spring Lake Beach Closes



Spring Lake Beach's regular season ends August 23rd. It will be open again on August 29th and 30th, and on September 5th, 6th and 7th. Lifeguards are on duty from 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Swimming is allowed from sunrise to sunset. However, when no lifeguards are on duty, and you want to swim, it will be at your own risk. When lifeguards are off duty, swimmers age 16 and under must be accompanied by an adult. When there is a rain event, it is recommended that you wait to swim in the lake for 24 to 48 hours because of the possibility of bacteria in the water. Wastehauler Fees Could go Up Dramatically!



In the first few months of 2008, the Village recycled approximately 250 tons of materials. In the same time period in 2009 the Village only recycled 200 tons of materials! WHAT HAPPENED! A couple of questions are raised when considering this situation. First, are people not buying as much so there is less to recycle due to the bad economy? Second, are people not being as careful and are throwing recyclable materials away instead of recycling them?

One way to check our recycling rate is to compare it to the amount of material that was land filled during the same periods. For instance, during the first few months of 2008, 310 tons of material was land filled. During that same period for 2009, 342 tons of materials was land filled. Clearly it is not an issue of buying less – it is an issue of throwing perfectly good materials into our landfills.

PLEASE do not throw out materials that could be recycled. First, the more waste you throw away the less room we have in the landfill. We only have a few more years until the landfill is full and then our wastehaulers will have to ship our waste to other locations. When that happens our waste collection bills will become very expensive! Second, the more you recycle the more material is recovered to be used for products saving virgin materials from being used for the same purpose.

The individual residential wastehauler will take the following recyclable materials: paper, newspaper, cardboard, glass bottle and jars, plastic, cans, magazines and paper bags.

School's Starting, Drive Carefully

Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination Program

The Village of Lincolnshire is required to comply with the Phase II regulations of the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) under the Clean Water Act. These regulations are designed to ensure that surface waters are free of pollutants. The program targets homeowners and small businesses in an effort to stop them from disposing of pollutants improperly by releasing them directly into the environment or into a storm sewer. Storm sewers, unlike sanitary sewers, go directly into the nearest river without being treated. When enough household chemicals, such as used motor oil and antifreeze, make their way into our waterways, it can kill fish and plants living in or near the water.

As part of the NPDES, Lincolnshire conducts an illicit discharge detection program. The program involves inspecting the Village's storm sewers when they should be dry, such as during a summer dry spell. If liquid is found in the storm sewers, the liquid is evaluated to determine its contents. In the event that the liquid contains anything other than stormwater, the Village traces the liquid to its source to determine the responsible party. The responsible party is required to take corrective action to eliminate the discharge. In some cases, the party may be fined.

If you would like to report a case of illegal dumping or have any other water quality concerns, call the Village at 847-913-2366.

Remember, only rain water should be placed into storm sewers.

Fall Branch Collection

On Monday, September 21st, the Village will be providing a branch pickup. This is an opportunity for residents to get rid of branches, trimmings or small trees that have been removed. The Village has hired a contractor to drive through the Village and pick up and dispose of this material. There is no fee for this service so this is a great opportunity to cut down and get rid of your buckthorn and other dead or declining woody vegetation.



To participate in this program:

- Only cut branches or trees (smaller than 6 inches) will be collected. (Note that some small twigs and leaves may be too small to be chipped.)
- All cut material to be collected must be placed at the curb by 7:00 a.m., Monday, September 21st. The contractor will do his best to get it picked up from your property by Friday, September 26th.
- Participants may begin placing material at the curb on Saturday, September 19th. Care should be taken to keep material out of the street. All material must be on the owner's property.
- Branches must be placed perpendicular to the curb with the cut end facing the street. Material may be stacked, but all cut ends must face the street.
- Do not bundle or tie the material together. (If you are placing material at the curb for Waste Management and you have landscape collection, you are required to bundle it. Do not place that material in the same area where you will be placing branches which are being collected by the Village contractor.)
- No root balls, lawn clippings or other landscape waste will be collected.
- In the event of rain there may be a delay in collecting the material. Please note that the material will be picked up as soon as it is possible.
- Be advised that there may be small twigs and leaves left behind. It is the responsibility of the participant to collect and dispose of all material that is too small to be chipped or is left behind.

This program was very successful last year, and we anticipate similar participation in 2009. Your patience during this process will be greatly appreciated. - **Sprinkling Restrictions** - Outside water usage is restricted in the Village between May 15th and September 15th. If your address ends in an even number (0, 2, 4, 6, 8), then you may use outside water on calendar days which are even. Similarly, if your address ends in an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7, 9), you may use outside water on calendar days which are odd.
