Public Hearing

Improvements to Route 45 and Milwaukee Avenue in Lincolnshire

The Illinois Department of Transportation will be holding a public meeting about the reconstruction and widening of U.S. 45 from IL 60 to IL 22. This project includes the widening of Milwaukee Avenue from Olde Half Day Road to Marriott Drive in Lincolnshire. The project is just beginning the design phase, and construction is not anticipated to begin for several years.

The meeting will be held on Tuesday, May 19, 2009, at the Sullivan Center, 294 Evergreen Drive, Vernon Hills. The meeting will be in an open-house format, meaning that are you free to attend any time between 4 and 7 PM.

Picnics, Cook Outs, Canoe Trips?

If you are thinking of having a picnic this summer, consider using one of the Village Parks. Maximum number of people are listed in



parenthesis. Small group picnics (30) are allowed at Spring Lake, Balzer, Old Mill and Memorial Parks. Small and large group picnics are allowed in the North Park concession area (200), North Park Pavilion (40), Bicentennial Park (50) and Whytegate Park (50).

Spring Lake Park and North Park have large grills available for use. In addition, Spring Lake has a fire pit and North Park has a fire place – each available for use.

The Village has a canoe rack at Rivershire Park where Village residents may store their canoes for a week or all summer. There is a small usage fee but it makes it very convenient to carry your canoe to the river and store it quickly when you are done.

Spring Lake Beach Opens

Spring Lake Beach will be open between May 23rd and May 31st - weekends only. Regular Season begins June 1st through August 23rd. Lifeguards are on duty daily from 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Swimming is allowed from sunrise to sunset. However, when no lifeguards are on duty and you want to swim, it will be at your own risk. When lifeguards are off duty, swimmers age 16 and under must be accompanied by an adult. When there is a rain event, it is recommended that you wait to swim in the lake for 24 to 48 hours because of the possibility of bacteria in the water. National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES)

Because we live in a watershed, we impact water runoff from rain. Our impact can negatively affect the quality of our streams and rivers. The Village has enacted regulations prohibiting the introduction of pollutants or chemicals into the storm sewers as these pipes lead to open waterways. Residents can take steps to keep contaminated water on their properties. This can be done by directing water runoff from our roofs, sump pumps and driveways into rain barrels, rain gardens, open vegetated swales or other features where that water can be used in a constructive way or absorbed by plants. Residents should consider installing plants on their properties that are native to our area. These plants require less watering and absorb more water than many non-native plants.

Community Rating System

The Village of Lincolnshire has been a member of the National Flood Insurance Program's Community Rating System since 1992. The CRS program is a voluntary auditing program that is used to assure our residents that the Village meets or exceeds the requirements of the NFIP. The CRS measures the Village's activities relating to the floodplain and rewards communities which have strong floodplain ordinances and who take a proactive stance against flooding. The CRS assigns credits to a variety of activities taken to ensure appropriate floodplain management measures are implemented. A main criterium of these activities is that the Village achieve a Building Code Effectiveness Grading Schedule of 5 or better. Lincolnshire has maintained a high grade of 3/3 since 2001. Credits in the CRS program are totaled and put into classifications with 'Class 10' being the lowest classification and 'Class 1' being the highest. The Village first achieved a Class 9 rating upon initiation. Since 2005, the Village has been a Class 5 community.

Residents who purchase flood insurance for structures located in the floodplain are currently eligible to receive a 25 percent discount on their flood insurance premiums under the Village's Class 5 rating. Structures located outside of the floodplain receive a 10 percent discount on premiums. Preferred Risk Policies do not receive discounts. As of September 2007 (the most recent period for which data is available), there were 117 NFIP policies in the Village with a total annual premium of \$91,740. Through its participation in the CRS program, policy holders in Lincolnshire saved a combined \$19,444 that year.

Summer Water Restrictions

Outside water usage will be restricted in the Village between May 15th through September 15th. If your address ends in an even number (0, 2, 4, 6, 8), then you may use outside water on calendar days which are even. Similarly, if your address ends in an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7, 9), you may use outside water on calendar days which are odd. Despite the vast pool of water to our east known as Lake Michigan, there is not an unlimited supply of water in this area. Under an international treaty, communities bordering Lake Michigan are restricted in the amount of water that can be withdrawn from the lake. As a result, the Illinois Department of Natural Resources, Office of Water Resources, requires communities to take measures to conserve water. Outside water use restrictions are implemented by communities as one such conservation. In Lincolnshire, residents may use potable water outside-of-buildings, including water used for sprinkling of lawns and gardens or washing cars, in accordance with this odd/even schedule.



Spring Lake Beach Rules



If you plan to use Spring Lake Beach, you should make yourself aware of the beach's rules:

- All beach users are responsible to review beach rules as posted at the beach.
- If no lifeguard is on duty, swimmers swim at their own risk.
- If present, lifeguards are responsible for enforcing safety rules and responding to emergencies. Parents or guardians should supervise their children.
- Children ages 10 and under must be accompanied and supervised by an adult (18 or older).
- No one should swim alone.
- Entrance to the water shall only be from the beach.
- Patrons are encouraged to protect themselves from sun exposure.
- All children who are not toilet-trained shall wear tight fitting rubber or plastic pants.
- Children in flotation devices must be accompanied by an adult at all times.
- Persons under the age of 16 must be accompanied by a responsible person 16 years of age or older unless a lifeguard is present.
- All persons in the beach area, when a lifeguard is on duty, are required to pay a fee between the hours of 10:30 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.
- Appropriate beach attire is required at all times in the beach area.
- Swimmers of questionable skill are required to take and pass a swim test prior to being allowed on the water feature or in deep water.
- Season Tags or Daily Wristbands must be clearly visible to the lifeguard.
- The lake water is not suitable for drinking. Avoid swallowing lake water.
- Admission to the beach may be refused to all persons having any contagious disease, infectious conditions such as colds, fever, ringworm, foot infections, skin lesions, carbuncles, boils, diarrhea, vomiting, inflamed eyes, ear discharges, or any other condition which has the appearance of being infectious. Persons with excessive sunburn, abrasions, which have not healed, or bandages of any kind may also be refused admittance. A person under the influence of alcohol or exhibiting erratic behavior shall not be permitted in the beach area.
- Littering is prohibited. In addition, no alcohol, food, gum or tobacco is allowed on the beach or in the water.
- Glass containers are prohibited throughout the beach area.
- Personal conduct within the beach must be such that safety is not jeopardized.
- Diving is not permitted.
- Swimming is prohibited after sunset or before sunrise, or when lightning is present, including a 30 minute period after the last lightning is observed.
- No pets are permitted in the park or beach area.
- Feeding of wildlife or other actions that encourage their presence is prohibited and are subject to a fine under the Village Code.
- Groups of 15 to 30 persons must purchase a beach permit. Groups larger than 30 are prohibited.

Garden Spot

Celebrity Plant of the Month is Calamagrostis x acuriflora 'Karl Foerster', or Karl Foerster's Feather Reed Grass.



Grasses add structure, architectural interest and texture to perennial gardens, as well as provide winter interest and a winter food source for birds. This stately ornamental grass is one of the earliest grasses to bloom. It is about 4' to 5' tall, stands upright and has slender, dark green blades. Green to pinkish flower panicles appear early in the summer, becoming attractive light brown seed heads later in the season. The plant requires full sun and moist soil with good drainage, but will tolerate a wide range of soil types. It remains tidy throughout the growing season and requires little maintenance. Cut it down to the ground in early spring.

Garden Tip of the Month: Choose the right plant for the right place in the garden.

Perennials, annuals, and ornamental shrubs purchased at garden centers generally have care tags attached to their containers. If a tag reads "FULL SUN", that plant must be placed in a garden spot which receives at least 6 hours of sun daily. Otherwise, it will not thrive-it may even die-and will bring disappointment instead of pleasure to the purchaser. Light requirements for outdoor plants are as follows:

FULL SUN-6 hours or greater; PARTIAL SUN-3 to 6 hours; PARTIAL SHADE-3 hours or less.

Also, as the trees surrounding garden areas grow or if a tree in a garden area is removed, the amount of sunlight a garden receives will be altered as well. Sun perennials in a once full sun location may become leggy, less floriferous or even disappear, as extended tree branches gradually limit sunlight. Similarly, shade perennials, suddenly exposed to sunlight as a result of a downed tree, may exhibit scorched leaves or burn out completely.

Relocating these plantings to more suitable locations will restore their vigor.

The annual Chicago River Day is scheduled for Saturday, May 9th, from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon. There are two locations in Lincolnshire where individuals can participate in this annual celebration of the river: North Park, 1025 Riverwoods Road and Sutton Place. Property Maintenance Program in Lincolnshire



The mission of the property maintenance program in the Village is to maintain and improve the overall living environment of the residential and commercial areas in the community. This not only includes keeping the Village esthetically pleasing but also safe from code violations that may affect the welfare and safety of our residents. In order to achieve this goal, the Village has implemented the International Property Maintenance Code in conjunction with the Village of Lincolnshire's Ordinances. The point of the program is to maintain the high quality of life expected by the Village's residents.

The majority of property maintenance violations received by the Village actually come from residents themselves. There is a very specific process that is followed to ensure that a complaint is taken care of from beginning to end.

1. Once a complaint is received, a visual inspection is performed. If a violation is observed, a Notice of Violation letter is sent by U.S. mail. A specific time frame is given to remedy the violation.
2. Following the deadline provided, a visual re-inspection is performed. If the violation has been remedied, the file is closed. If the violation still exists, a second letter is sent with a shorter deadline to come into compliance, usually one week. This letter is always sent by certified mail.
3. Should the second deadline expire without compliance, a final site inspection occurs. If it is determined that the issue has not been remedied to Code, a "Notice to Appear" ticket will be issued. The resident will then be required to appear in court for a hearing.

The most common property maintenance concerns that the Village usually deals with are high grass complaints, noncompliant accessory structures, outside storage, refuse can location and illegal signage (residential and commercial).

The Village's main goal is not to issue tickets or fines, but to achieve compliance with the Code. The Village Staff is more than happy to work with our residents to rectify any property maintenance concerns they may have, in fact we encourage it. This program can only be successful with your help and diligence. While daily general inspections of the neighborhoods are conducted, it is not possible for the Village to be aware of all the property maintenance concerns in the community. We are asking that if you are aware of any property maintenance issues, or if you have any questions about possible violations in your area, that you please feel free to contact the Code Enforcement Inspector, Nicole Koleno at 847-913-2317 and she will be happy to answer any of your questions or concerns.

The Village of Lincolnshire is a great place to live because of all the hard work and pride the residents have in their community. Let's work together to keep Lincolnshire a beautiful place we can call home.

Obstructions in the Right-of Way

You may not realize that the first 10 to 15 feet of land from the back of the curb toward your house is publicly owned property known as the Right-of-Way (ROW). If you live on a corner, then the ROW would exist on two sides of your lot.

Right-of-Way is designed to hold the roadway and the utilities necessary for the quality of life enjoyed by each Lincolnshire resident. This land is also made available to the Village and various utility companies to maintain and improve their own facilities.

According to Village Code, residents must cut grass and trim vegetation within the ROW. No one shall place any obstructions in the ROW, with the exception of electric dog fences and underground sprinkler systems. Before installing either of these systems, residents are required to 'sign off' acknowledging that they are responsible for those private facilities. Mailboxes and driveways typically are not considered to be obstructions and are permitted to be placed within the ROW.

Boulders, landscape gardens, fences and other fixtures within the public ROW are considered obstructions. The Village may require those items to be removed if they present a hazard or an issue to the public's use and enjoyment of the ROW. If obstructions are damaged, the Village will not participate in any repair or replacement.

Some typical situations that occur in the ROW, and the Village's response to them, include:

- **A snow plow inadvertently relocates a rock or boulder placed at a property corner or driveway.** The homeowner will be responsible for either replacing or removing this obstruction.
- **A snow plow hits a mailbox.** The Village will assist in the repair/replacement of the mailbox. More information on this issue may be found in the Village newsletter during the winter months.
- **A utility repair, such as repair of a watermain break, which requires removal of a portion of a landscape planting bed within the ROW.** The Village will return the area to grade and provide mulch or turf. The Village will not replace flowers, shrubs, ornamental trees, etc.
- **A driveway is damaged due to a utility repair or curb or street repairs.** The following criteria will be followed within the ROW:

<u>Type of Driveway</u>	<u>Replacement</u>
Existing Pavement	Replacement Pavement
Plain hot asphalt surface	Replace in kind
Imprinted hot asphalt surface	Replace with plain hot asphalt
Plain concrete pavement	Replace in kind
Imprinted or decorative concrete	Replace with plain concrete
Cobblestones	Replace in kind
Aggregate or stone	Replace with plain hot asphalt

Good Humor Truck & Safety

With the arrival of summer comes the Good Humor truck traveling through the Village. With this in mind, parents should discuss certain safety tips with their children:

1. Children should never go to the ice cream truck without their parents' knowledge.
2. Children should wait until the ice cream truck comes to their house and should not chase the truck to other streets.
3. Children should never step into the street. Wait up on the curb until the truck comes to a complete stop before approaching it.
4. Be extremely careful if it is necessary to cross the street to get to the truck. Look left, right and left again before crossing.
5. Never get inside the ice cream truck. The vendor can make the transaction from the truck window.
6. Parents should accompany their children whenever possible, but at a minimum, they should keep an eye on the children at all times.

The ice cream vendor is required to hold a license from the Village which will contain his name, company name and his photograph. If the vendor does not have a license, please notify the Police Department.

Reconstruction of Illinois Route 22 at U.S. Route 45/Illinois Route 21 (Milwaukee Avenue to Start this Summer)

The Illinois Department of Transportation will open bids for the reconstruction of the intersection of IL Route 22 at U.S. Route 45/Illinois Route 21 (Milwaukee Avenue) on April 24, 2009. The work on Route 22 fills in the gap between projects constructed over the last few years. The limits of work along Route 22 are just west of the driveway into McDonalds to the Indian Creek Bridge. The limits of the work along Milwaukee Avenue extend from just north of Marriott Drive to the north side of the Marathon gas station.

Work is scheduled to begin in late May and will continue through June 2010. During the construction, there will be significant impacts to traffic. The project includes the reconstruction of the pavement, replacement of the traffic signal, and construction of a pedestrian path along the south side. The lane configurations will be as follows upon the completion of the project:

- Northbound - One left-turn lane; Two through lanes; One right-turn lane
- Southbound - One left-turn lane; Two through lanes; One right-turn lane
- Eastbound - Two left-turn lanes; Two through lanes; One right-turn lane
- Westbound - Two left-turn lanes; Two through lanes; One right-turn lane

The estimated construction cost to improve the road is \$6.5 million.

The Village will be contributing approximately \$483,000 to this project. The Village will pay IDOT to adjust Village utilities as necessary to construct the road improvements. The Village's contributions will go toward construction of the last remaining segment of the east-west bike path west of the Des Plaines River. In addition, the Village will pay to upgrade the appearance of the traffic signals as well as to install pedestrian signals that count down the remaining time to cross the street. The Village will also pay IDOT to construct the right-in/right-out entrance to the downtown parcel and construct a left-turn lane on Milwaukee Avenue for the future connection of Knightsbridge Parkway. Finally, the Village will have IDOT install enhanced median treatments to improve the aesthetics and to reduce the maintenance costs of the medians.

Tennis Court Rules

Spring is here and activity in the Village parks will increase. Please be aware of the rules for use of the Village tennis courts. One which is particularly important - Teaching of tennis lessons on Village courts is only allowed if you are a resident teaching another family member. Rack-up rules are posted at each of the Village tennis courts. Because the rules are slightly different, depending upon whether there is a single court or there are multiple courts, please be sure to read the rules carefully. Following is an example of one set of rack-up rules:



1. Only Lincolnshire Residents or their guests may rack up.
2. You must rack up in person. You may not rack up for anyone else.
3. You may only rack up during the one hour period prior to the desired time.
4. You must be present while your racket is holding court.
5. You may not rack up on a second court while you are playing.
6. You must have a two person minimum to hold a court.
7. Even number courts must be vacated every hour on the hour. Odd number courts must be vacated every hour on the half hour.
8. Absolutely no bicycles, skateboards, or vehicular traffic is allowed on the courts. Any violation will be considered an act of vandalism and subject to penalties under the law.
9. Practice sessions shall not interfere with adjoining courts.
10. The teaching of tennis lessons is prohibited with the exception of a Lincolnshire resident teaching a family member. (Proof of identification may be required.)
11. No individual, organization, or entity of any kind shall use the Village's parks and/or park facilities in the course of any for-profit activity.
