No Right Turn on Red Signs at Olde Half Day Road and Route 21

The construction at Route 22 and Milwaukee Avenue has caused a significant change in the traffic patterns within the Downtown Triangle as people try to find the quickest route through the area. Staff has received several inquiries as to why the “NO TURN ON RED” signs are in place at the north intersection of Olde Half Day Road and Milwaukee Avenue (adjacent to Bank of America) on the east approach despite the increased traffic and perceived delay that these signs may be causing.

In July 2008 while the Police Department was researching accident data for a proposed Red Light Camera Program (which the Village Board chose not to implement) it found an unusually high accident rate at the intersection of Olde Half Day Road and Milwaukee Avenue by Walgreens and the Bank of America. The accidents were directly attributable to vehicles making a right turn on red from westbound Olde Half Day Road to northbound Milwaukee Avenue. Drivers turning right would begin to go and then notice a northbound Milwaukee Avenue vehicle coming over the rise to the south. They would hit the brakes and be rear-ended by the vehicle directly behind them, who was also looking to the south preparing to go, not realizing the car in front of them had stopped. Some of the accidents were serious enough to activate the vehicles airbag systems, which is a costly repair.

The Police Department brought this situation to the attention of the Village's Engineering Department. In a 12-month period we experienced 34 collisions directly related to right turns on red. After reviewing the situation and the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, the Engineering Department then sent a letter to the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) requesting that it investigate the intersection. IDOT agreed with the problem and installed the NO TURN ON RED signs in August 2008. Two of the criteria IDOT used to justify the placement of the signs were an inadequate sight distance to the south and 3 or more accidents within a 12-month period attributable to the right turn on red movement.

Since the signs were installed one year ago, accidents involving right turns on red at this approach have decreased from 34 for the year preceding the installation to 6 in the year after the installation of the signs. The Police Department has also conducted a visual study of the intersection during the peak p.m. hours and observed that in many cases, right turning traffic cannot reach the right-turn lane due to the significant back ups of the straight through traffic.

While these signs have caused concern and frustration with many drivers, the safety factor was paramount in erecting these signs. IDOT has tentative plans to reconfigure this intersection at some point in the future which may correct the problem.

We have also observed many drivers, in an attempt to avoid this intersection driving, through the North Village Green and cutting through to Milwaukee Avenue. This is a traffic violation and could result in a \$75 ticket. The solution is to please allow a little extra time while driving in this area.

Budget Information for FY2010

We have begun working on the new Budget that will guide the Village from January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2010. The following dates have been tentatively scheduled for resident input into this process:

Final Budget consideration and approval is expected to occur on Monday, December 14th.

Fall Leaf Collection

The Public Works Department began its annual Leaf Collection Program on Monday, October 5th. Leaves must be placed in the street by noon on Monday of your specified pickup week to guarantee one final collection by Friday. Leaves placed in the street after that final collection is made will not be picked up until your next scheduled week of collection.

Leaf pickup is scheduled for Monday through Friday according to the following schedule:

Residents West of Riverwoods Rd.

Week of November 2

Week of November 16

Week of November 30

Residents East of Riverwoods Rd.

Week of November 9

Week of November 23

Please be careful not to mix foreign materials such as brush, garden waste, tree limbs, vines, lumber, etc. with your leaves. Materials such as these can cause equipment failure or injury to the operator or nearby citizens.

Due to the large volume of leaves, Public Works' crews can only pick up leaves on one side of the Village each week. It is important to follow the schedule and not place leaves in the street for more than two to three days before your scheduled week of pickup. You may rake your leaves and place them on your grass near the curb as shown in the picture, then rake them into the street during your scheduled week. Leaves piled in the street during off-scheduled weeks become a fire hazard and can obstruct drivers' views of children at play. They also block the storm sewer inlets causing localized flooding. Please notify your landscaper of the Village's leaf pickup schedule if applicable.

There Are Specific Requirements When Disposing of Leaves and Landscape Materials

With the fall weather upon us, the leaves will soon be falling from the trees. Though as a Village we all love the trees in our area, let's face it, we are not fond of the fall clean up they require. You may be unaware, but the Village has specific requirements pertaining to the disposal of leaves and other landscape materials. First, the Village prohibits any type of open burning of landscape materials. Village Code, Section 4-2A-2b, states in part that within the boundaries of the Village, open burning of landscape waste as defined to include leaves, trees, tree trimmings, branches, stumps, brush, weeds, grass, shrubbery and yard trimmings is prohibited.

Only during leaf collection season can residents place leaves along their curb, but other times of the year, residents are prohibited from dumping or depositing any grass, leaves, branches, parts of trees or any thing else in any public way, river, stream or drainage ditch within the Village.

Residents are asked to please place yard clippings and other landscape materials in the proper recyclable bags to be picked up by Waste Management. If you do not subscribe to a yard waste pick up plan with Waste Management, please be aware that you will be required to purchase yard waste stickers from the Village and place them on the exterior of the bags. These stickers can be purchased at the Village Hall and are sold in sheets of five for \$13.30. Bags are available at most hardware stores or grocery stores.

Looking Ahead To Spring



In the spring, the Village will be offering a plant sale for residents to purchase native plants for their property at a reduced price. Now is a good time to take a look around your property and see what you would like to do with that puddle in the backyard, that stream of water that runs to the curb and into the stormsewer or that large patch of grass that is in need of mowing. Native plants offer wonderful alternatives for these problems. For instance, you could plant a rain garden – a garden that filters and absorbs water runoff from your roof or driveway – reducing the amount of water going into the stormsewers or puddles in your yard. You could replace mowed turf with native plants and grasses that attract birds and butterflies or you could plant some interesting plants under your trees where the ground may be bare (after you have removed all that buckthorn!).

If you need assistance determining a location for a rain garden or types of plants that you could use, feel free to contact the Village. There are plant lists for sunny locations, shady locations and rain gardens.

Using native plants on your property helps to clean up the water in our rivers (Chicago River and Des Plaines River). It helps to reduce flooding and it also creates habitat for native birds, butterflies and other insects.

Child Safety Seats



With the holidays approaching, residents should be aware that the Village loans infant and toddler booster seats, without charge, on a first-come, first-serve basis. If you have relatives or friends with children coming into town for the upcoming holidays and need an infant, toddler or booster seat, call 847-883-9900 to reserve your seat. Please call early. The supply is limited!

We have two rear-facing infant seats that can be used for children 5 to 22 pounds; two rear-facing convertible seats for 5-30 pounds and forward facing for children 20-40 pounds, (and at least 1 year of age if forward facing). We also have 3 booster seats for children 40-100 pounds.

All of the seats are equipped to be used with the LATCH systems in all new vehicles.

Annual Toys for Tots Collection



Once again the Village of Lincolnshire will have a collection box for "Toys for Tots" beginning on Monday, November 16th and ending on Wednesday, December 16th.

Toys for Tots began in 1947 when Major Bill Hendricks, United States Marine Corps Reserve, and a group of Marine Reservists in Los Angeles collected and distributed 5,000 toys to needy children. The idea came from Bill's wife, Diane. In the fall of 1947, Diane handcrafted a Raggedy Ann doll and asked Bill to deliver the doll to an organization, which would give it to a needy child at Christmas. When Bill determined that no agency existed, Diane told Bill that he should start one. He did. The 1947 pilot project was so successful that the Marine Corps adopted Toys for Tots in 1948 and expanded it into a nationwide campaign. That year, Marine Corps Reserve units across the nation conducted Toys for Tots campaigns in each community in which a Marine Reserve Center was located. Marines have conducted successful nationwide campaigns at Christmas each year since 1948. In 2001, Toys for Tots ranked #289th in "Philanthropy 400" and in 2005 it ranked 66 in "Philanthropy 400"!

Mayor Blomberg has made Toys for Tots an **annual charity** in the Village, and we encourage all of the businesses and residents to hop on board! 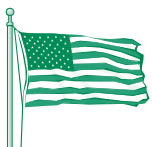

Automatic Pay for Water/Sewer Bills

Did you know that you can pay your water/sewer bills by an Automatic Utility Pay method through direct deposit from your bank? Money to cover the amount of your water bill must be in your bank account on the bill's due date.

You'll be able to tell if your payment will be credited to your account by looking at your bill. It will state "Auto-Pay". This means the amount of the bill will be automatically deducted from a personal account you have specified. Of course, our regular method of mailing water/sewer bills will continue for those not interested in "Automatic Utility Pay", but we encourage you to "sign up"!

Village of Lincolnshire Rules and Regulations 2009

This is a summary of various Village Rules and Regulations that may affect Village residents. Regulations may be added or modified after this writing. If you are not sure if there is a Village regulation regarding something of interest to you, please call the Communications Manager at 847.913-2334. Cut and keep this page for future use..

BUILDING PERMITS are required prior to starting any construction, alteration, addition or restoration of any building or structure or its service equipment.

CATS do not have to be registered in the Village.

CERTIFICATES OF OCCUPANCY are required for any change of use and must be obtained prior to occupying any building or structure or part thereof for which a building permit has been issued.

CURFEW is applicable to any person under 17 years of age. It is enforced between 12:01 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. Saturday and Sunday, and on Sunday through Thursday between 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. the following day.

DETACHED STRUCTURES such as sheds are permitted under specific Village regulations. Contact the Community Development Department for more information, 847-913-2310

DOGS do not have to be registered in the Village but are required to have a current rabies tag.

DRIVEWAYS and other paved surfaces cannot be less than 5 feet from property line.

FENCES and screen walls, dog runs, satellite antennas, children's play structures, pools, and tennis courts are regulated by Village Ordinances. Contact the Department of Community Development for more information and be sure to obtain a permit prior to any construction.

SPRINKLING RESTRICTIONS Outside water usage will be restricted in the Village between May 15th and September 15th. If your address ends in an even number (0, 2, 4, 6, 8), then you may use outside water on calendar days which are even. Similarly, if your address ends in an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7, 9), you may use outside water on calendar days which are odd.

PARKS HOURS are from 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. year round, except North Park which is open from 6:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.

PEDDLERS The Village has specific rules regarding peddlers and solicitors in the Village. Please contact the Police Department for more information.

PETS are not allowed in Lincolnshire parks. It is unlawful to keep in excess of three dogs or three cats or any combination of such animals in excess of a total of three upon any residential lot within the Village.

REAL ESTATE TRANSFER STAMP must be affixed to the deed of any real estate property transferred within the Village. Stamps are sold at the rate of \$3.00 for every \$1,000 in selling price of property. A final water meter reading must be made before the Village will issue the stamps. Contact the Village Hall at least two weeks before your closing to arrange for a final water meter reading.

RECREATIONAL VEHICLES Outdoor parking of recreational vehicles including but not limited to boats, trailers, snowmobiles, campers, house trailers, motor homes or commercial trucks is prohibited in residential zoned districts with some exceptions. Call the Police Department for more information.

SIGNS are strictly regulated through the Village. Real estate and garage sale signs do not require a permit but must comply with specific requirements. Contact the Department of Community Development for more information.

SITE WORK PERMITS are required for any paving, grading or utility work (water, sewer).

SNOWMOBILES are prohibited in any public street, right-of-way, park or other public place in Lincolnshire.

SPEED LIMIT is 20 MPH in residential areas unless otherwise posted.

SUMP PUMPS may not discharge out to Village streets between November 1st and April 1st of each year.

SWIM TAGS are required to swim at Spring Lake Park Beach. Call the Village Hall for more information.

TREES and conservancy areas are protected by Village Ordinances. Permits must be obtained prior to the removal of any tree 6" or greater in diameter or the removal of any group of trees whose diameter totals 6". Contact the Village Forester in the Department of Community Development for more information.

VANDALISM Parents may be held financially responsible for the vandalism committed by their minor children in Lincolnshire.

VEHICLE STICKERS are not required in the Village.

Important Information

- **Dumping in drainage ditches** and detention basins is prohibited by Village Code. A fine will be assessed to anyone in violation. Questions? Call Rob Horne, Engineering Supervisor, at 847.913.2366.
- **Waste Management North is the single waste hauler for most residents in Lincolnshire.** If you have questions or problems, the waste hauler can be reached at 800.796.9696 or 630.724.8400. However, if you are a member of a Homeowners' Association, your home is not necessarily covered by Waste Management North. Check with your Homeowners' Association for more information.
- **If you have any old major appliances you wish to discard, call Environmental Field Service at 800.480.4337.** This service will collect these appliances for a fee that is much lower than what Waste Management North would charge.
- **Problems with Comcast Broadband Cable?** Call its Customer Service Department at 866.594.1234. **Comcast Internet** - call 888.262.6300, and **Comcast Telephone** - call 800.266.2278. **Unburied cable?** If you don't get satisfaction, contact Carol Marshall at the Village of Lincolnshire - 847.913.2334.
